### Parker and Chase Announce for Presidency

Dr. Howard W. Parker, Jr., GBSC Vice President-at-Large, and Dr. Percy R. Chase, Community Baptist Church Pastor, Are Candidates for the Presidency of the General Baptist State Convention



The Rev. Dr. Howard W. Parker, Jr., Pastor of the Sycamore Hill Missionary Baptist Church in Greenville, N.C., has announced his candidacy for the office of president of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. Parker began serving the Convention during the presidency of Dr.

E.B. Turner as Exhibit Chairman and was elected Fourth Vice President of the Convention during the presidency of Dr. Clifford A. Jones.

Dr. Parker is a native of Winston-Salem, N.C. where he grew up in the Mt. Zion Baptist Church under the pastorate of Dr. K.O.P. Goodwin and was ordained by the Rowan Baptist Association. He is a product of Shaw University where he majored in Religion; Winston-Salem State University where he majored in History and minored in Political Science; studied at Babcock Graduate School of Management, Wake Forest University and the United Christian College.

Rev. Parker states that he is committed to missions at home and the foreign field. He is committed to supporting churches with resources and/or individuals to further their Christian Educational needs through Workshops, Training Sessions and Worship Experiences. He plans to create an Annual Summit for Moderators to sit down with him and the Vice Presidents to discuss the issues and concerns of churches in their location as a means of discovering methods to correct or solve problems or concerns in a given location. He will work towards an Annual time when the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina and the Baptist State Convention can jointly cosponsor a Race Relations Sunday across the State. He will also make an effort to contact churches that have not represented in the Convention over the last three years. After identifying needs, he will work towards asking Pastors who have contractors, builders, plumbers, etc., who are members of Missionary Baptist churches across the

The Rev. Percy Raymond Chase was born in Washington, DC to the late Dr. Lendall W. Chase, Sr. and Elnora Elizabeth Ellis Chase.

Rev. Chase received his education in the public schools of Danville, Virginia, Norfolk State University, Norfolk, Virginia—Business Administration (1976), Southeastern Baptist Theological Semi-



nary, Wake Forest, North Carolina—Master of Divinity (1980). Rev. Chase was conferred by the Apex School of Theology the Doctor of Divinity (1998).

In 1974, Rev. Chase accepted the Lord's Call to "preach the Gospel" of Christ. Rev. Chase became the pastor of the Community Baptist Church, Durham, North Carolina April 1978 and has served as pastor for thirty-two years.

Service in the Lord's vineyard includes, General Board (1982-2006), Executive Committee (Assistant & Secretary, 1992-2002), Resolutions Committee, and Headquarters Staff Worker (1990-2005) all of the General Baptist State Convention, NC, Inc. Moderator, New Hope Association (1995-1999), President, IMA of Durham and Vicinity (1994-1996), Executive Board of the Recovering Women Services, Durham, NC, Member—NAACP, has served as Instructor of the Young Peoples Leadership Course of the National Baptist Congress on Christian Education, National Baptist Convention USA, Inc.

Rev. Chase also serves as the National Director of the National Baptist Student Union Retreat, a Campus Ministry for students attending Historically Black Colleges and Universities (1996-Present).

Partnership—Support for Auxiliary Work (Article IV, Section 8)

To promote their work and the mission of the Convention, our auxiliaries need expansion in their session time and place. They are each unique in ministry and purpose for our Baptist Churches and the Convention. They should have their own time. An organized scheduling of their sessions throughout the state gives the Convention and the churches wider access to the needs of the churches and what the Convention has to provide.

Preparedness— Adequate Headquarters Staff (Articles V, Section 6)

The Convention's mission and work requires adequate and effective staff. State Missions must be defined with the understanding that Headquarters Costs and Program Costs need equal attention.

Stewardship—Managing Mission and Work (Articles III and IV)

It has been said "the convention has nothing to offer the churches"—Our constitution says something else. With 22 Auxiliaries, Boards, Departments, Committees and Commissions, the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, Inc. has and can still answer the "call" by these words 'Here am I, send Me.

#### Goals for the Tenure

- A book each year on Baptist Work to be studied and put to use in speaking to the needs of our Baptist Churches. Organized through the Associations and the Congress on Christian Education Auxiliary.
- The development of a Rural Pastor's Department in the Convention for our Baptist Churches. Its work will embrace those needs specific of the Rural Pastor.
- The establishment of an organized Pulpit Assistance Program for our Baptist Churches and Ministers.
   This effort will make available the "opportunity" for Ministers to serve our Baptist Churches and to help reduce vacancies in pulpits within our State.
- That GBSC, NC, Inc. with the Woman's Baptist Home and Foreign Missionary Convention appoint 100 students from HBCUs in North Carolina to promote Baptist work among students in local Baptist Churches.
- The organization of a crime prevention task force with associational and state support through Law enforcement and the Laymen's League.
- Each Vice-President organize their department according to the constitution that adequate effort can be made to secure financial support for that department.
- To develop methods in Evangelism for the local church.

Pastor Camps received his elementary education through High school in the New York City public school system, graduating from John Bowne High School. Following high school graduation, he continued his formal education at Bowie State University, Bowie, M.D., and received his bachelor of science degree. Pastor Camps also holds a master of science degree from George Mason University, Fairfax, Virginia and is currently pursuing his doctorate of theology at Andersonville Theological Seminary.

Rev. Camps retired from the military in August 2006 at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel after over 22 years, 11 months of service; he currently works at Fayetteville State University as Director of Sponsored Research & Programs. External Grants and Contracts of the University increased from \$7 million to \$14 million since his arrival.

God called Rev. Camps to pastor his first church, Pleasant Hill Missionary Baptist Church in Clarkton, N.C. He was also called to the pastorate of the Baldwin Branch Missionary Baptist Church and assumed his duties as the 15th Pastor. For a period of one year, Rev. Camps was the pastor for both churches and conducted two respective services each Sunday.

As the pastor of Baldwin Branch, the spirit of God moved immediately under his leadership. 
